I was asked to fill the role of Training Director which I accepted. When Reg joined HVA the structure of the ops team was reorganized into what we know today. I became Assistant Chief of Training. After 2 years I realized I was not happy in this role, so I was moved to a Lieutenant role. I did that for 3 or so years and I eventually requested to be on the road solely as a Paramedic. Since then, I have primarily been the keeper of data, ensuring accuracy and providing the needed information for Ops to make decisions on staffing levels, response plans. Currently I split my time between the road, SIM and Admin."
